



Rail Outward Mission to Singapore & Malaysia: 13 - 17 November 2017

UK railway suppliers are invited to join a trade mission to Singapore, and Kuala Lumpur, Melaka and Johor Bahru in Malaysia, in November 2017 to learn about regional rail projects and meet key stakeholders.

The Mission will take place in Singapore on 13 and 14 November, flying the latter afternoon to Kuala Lumpur for a programme on 15 November before travelling to Melaka and Johor Bahru for programmes on 16 and 17 November. The mission is timed the week before AusRAIL PLUS in Brisbane to allow UK companies the possibility to attend both events.

In Singapore, the government's ongoing development is to double its metro (MRT) system network by 2030, in total spending around £30bn on infrastructure projects. After the projects announced are delivered, Singapore will have four new railway lines and extensions to two others. Construction of the 43km long Thomson East Coast Line is well advanced, to open in stages during 2019-24, while construction of the Circle Line's final stage will start shortly, to be followed in later years by the 20km long Jurong Region Line and 50km long Cross Island Line.

Other areas of opportunity include: the Singapore-Kuala Lumpur High Speed Rail (HSR) line scheduled to open by end-2026, including its Assets Company (for rolling stock, trackwork, signalling, power and telecommunications systems) to be tendered by end-2017; a Rapid Transit System (RTS) Link between Singapore and Johor Bahru in Malaysia by 2024; Kuala Lumpur's three major new

MRT Lines; the 37km long LRT 3 system in the Klang Valley; and Malaysian and Singaporean clients' Asset Management and Condition Monitoring requirements.

Subject to final confirmation, the mission in Singapore will include:

- Group Meeting, including updates on MRT and HSR projects and procurement processes, and themed break-out sessions with the Land Transport Authority (LTA);
- Networking lunch with LTA senior management and project officials on 13 November;
- Meeting with local rail operator SMRT, to hear about upcoming projects and procurement, on 13 November;
- Networking Evening Reception at the British High Commission, including local and international companies operating in Singapore, on 13 November.
- Meeting with local rail operator SBS Transit, to hear about upcoming projects and procurement, on 14 November;
- Networking lunch with SBST senior management on 14 November;

In Malaysia, the mission, which will be of interest to both prime and supply chain companies, focuses on high value rail opportunities. The Malaysian National Land Public Transport Master Plan, 2012-2030 sets a 20-year timeline which targets to increase public transport modal share for urban areas to 40% in 2030 and improves public transport access to rural areas. Opportunities in the transport sector in Malaysia are sizeable, at a minimum of £30bn, possibly more than £50bn by 2020 according to Malaysian Government estimates. This fast-growing market is investing significantly in rail and, aside from the HSR and RTS lines to Singapore, includes: the Johor Bahru tram project; Kuala Lumpur's three major new MRT lines; the 37km LRT 3 system in the Klang Valley; and the East Coast Region Line.

Subject to final confirmation, the mission is planned to include:

- Networking Evening Reception at the British High Commission, including buyers, local and international companies operating in Malaysia on 14 November.
